



What you should know about visa liberalization?

- You will **be able to stay visa-free** up to 90 days (in any 180 day period) in the Schengen area.
- For a visa-free entry **you need a biometric passport** (valid for at least 3 months after the date you intend to leave the EU country you are visiting).
- You are **not automatically entitled to enter** the Schengen area.
- Border officials in EU countries may ask **for supporting documents that justify** the purpose and conditions of the intended stay (e.g. proof of lodging, return or round-trip ticket) and evidence of sufficient financial means.
- **Schengen area countries:**
Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and Switzerland. Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, and Romania will also apply the visa-free regime. However, with visa liberalization in place, you may not travel to Spain.

What you should know about visa liberalization?

- You **must not exceed 90 days** of stay (within any period of 180 days) in Schengen Area.
- Does **not enable you to seek asylum** in any state within Schengen Area.
- Does **not enable you to work** in Schengen Area.
- To study in one country of the Schengen Area, **you need a student visa issued by the authorities** of the respective state.
- The Border Police **may deny your entry if you do not meet the entry conditions** or the conditions for visa-free travel.
- Misuse and overstay **may be fined and result in being expelled and banned** from entry into the Schengen area for up to 5 years.
- The EU **may reinstate the visa regime for Kosovars if a relevant number of violations** of the conditions for visa-free travel is noted.

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
